RAM Coming to SWOSU to Provide Free Dental,

Remote Area Medical- RAM® -- a major nonprofit provider of mobile clinics delivering free, high-quality, dental, vision, and medical care to underserved and uninsured individuals--is coming to Southwestern Oklahoma State University in Weatherford on Saturday and Sunday, July 13-14.

The clinics will be held at the Pioneer Cellular Event Center, 900 N. Seventh Street.

Services available at the RAM clinic include dental cleanings, dental fillings, dental extractions, dental x-rays, eye exams, eyeglass prescriptions, eyeglasses made on-site, women's health exams, and general medical exams.

On Saturday, July 13, from 8 a.m. – 12 noon, Safe Kids NA-I-SHA and Oklahoma will be hosting a children's car seat checkup.

All RAM services are free and no ID is required. The clinics are operated in partnership with the Rural Health Network of Oklahoma. Dr. Randy Curry is the contact at SWOSU.

The clinic parking lot is currently scheduled to open no later than 12 a.m. midnight on Saturday, July 13. Ticket distribution typically begins at 3 a.m., and patients will be seen in chronological order according to their ticket.

The clinic doors open at 6 a.m. This process will repeat on Sunday, July 14. In some situations, such as inclement weather, volunteer cancellations, or other circumstances outside of RAM's control, ticketing may occur earlier than 3 a.m. RAM encourages everyone who would like services, especially dental services, to arrive as early as possible.


Vision and Medical Care

According to U.S. census data, the poverty rate in Oklahoma is 15.8%, which exceeds the national average of 12.7%. Additionally, nearly two out of every ten Oklahomans under the age of 65 lacks health insurance coverage. Because of these factors, RAM expects to see great demand from residents in western Oklahoma communities.

Last year, RAM provided nearly \$300,000 worth of free care to 566 people in Oklahoma.

"People can't reach their full potential if they are dealing with pain," said RAM CEO Jeff Eastman. "We have the ability and will to help them, so that's what we'll do."

Rita was preceded by her husband, both parents, brothers Clements and Lawrence Klein, and son Mike.





Need an Appraisal?

By definition, an Appraisal is an opinion of value. Opinions can vary and it has often been said that no two appraisers will agree. While this can be true, by following accepted procedures, called methodology, these differences between appraiser's opinions can be minimized. The needs for an appraisal can be varied and many.

I. The most common appraisal need is for the purpose of borrowing money to purchase a home or any other piece of property. It may be for a business. Most lenders require an appraisal of the property being purchased or used as collateral to secure the loan. In some cases, by Federal Regulations, this appraisal must be performed by a State Certified Licensed Appraiser. In other cases, usually depending on the amount of value, a license is not required. In most cases, the lender must be the one to order the appraisal.

2. Another reason for needing an appraisal, could be pricing your property for sale, Many times, if you are listing the property with a Realtor, they will provide what is called a market analysis, which can be a form of an appraisal. Keep in mind, not all real estate personnel are qualified to appraise real estate. Their training is mostly dedicated toward the ethical handling of sales.

Other appraisal uses include; legal disputes, such as a divorce or a land division, such as a partition suit. The settlement and basis computation for an estate may require an appraisal. Most of these types of appraisals do not require a licensed indi-

The cost of an appraisal will vary with its use, size and time to secure the needed data. You can always ask for an estimate of cost before engaging an appraiser. Remember, experience in appraisals can be critical to good methodology.

A definition of the word "Territorial Sleeper" is about a large size currency which does not show the word 'Territorial' on the note

After Oklahoma was admitted to the Union their Territorial notes needed the steel plates (which are used to imprint an image on a blank note) to be altered.

The Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP) had their "siderographers" (a mechanical process that enables unlimited reproduction of steel plates that are engraved by hand) to transfer the image on the plates to print

The above picture shows a \$10 Territorial Brown Back note from The State National Bank of Oklahoma City of which 5 are known to collectors.



CUSTER CO COMMISSIONERS/GALLOWAY -

At last week's meeting of the Board of Commissioners for Custer County, Emergency Management Director Mike Galloway updated commissioners on the status of the County's request for disaster assistance from the State of Oklahoma. Galloway said the request was submitted but the damage assessment would be delayed due to more significant storm damage in Easter Oklahoma. A disaster declaration was made at the previous meeting to begin the process of requesting assistance funds.

CLINTON ALERT SYSTEM/JOHNSTON - The City of Clinton will transition to a new alert system for notifications of emergencies and city news to its citizens. Clinton City Manager Robert Johnston says the new "Rave" System will replace the current system "Nixel." Johnston said he believes the new system is more user friendly than the former and reminds Clinton residents that they will have to sign up to receive notifications. The transition should take place during this month.

CUSTER COMMISSIONERS BOARD - Custer County Commissioners voted last week to approve a resolution that would increase the pay of Elected Officials in the County. The Board used the three factors established by State Statute to calculate the raises. Those being base salary which is set by the commissioners at their discretion, serviceability which is the revenue generated by the county and thirdly the service load, which is the population of the county as set by Census number. Commissioners may not adjust their own salary while holding office and the raise would increase the pay of elected officials just over \$5,300.00 per year.

WEATHERFORD ROTARY CLUB/DOWNS - The City of Weatherford and the Weatherford Rotary Club announced last week that they would rename the area of Rader Park between Eagle Field and the entrance to Prairie West Golf Course as Rotary Centennial Plaza. Rotary Club President Nate Downs says the area is already used for the Heartland Cruise and Car Show as well as Independence Day celebrations, and they have more plans for the space.

SWOSU Implements Changes at Sayre Remote Location



SWOSU is making changes to ensure that its Sayre location will continue to meet the higher education needs of western Oklahomans.

SWOSU will begin consolidating the operations of its remote location in Sayre into one facility. The additional buildings at the Sayre location will be transferred to a new owner who can better utilize and maintain those valuable properties.

SWOSU has operated its remote location in Sayre since 1987 when Sayre Junior College was merged with SWOSU. Since the merger, SWOSU's remote location at Sayre has been an integral part of SWOSU's overall operation and approach to meeting the needs of students. However, technological advancements have created new platforms such as role in their education from anywhere. SWOSU Sayre has experienced multi-year enrollment declines that drove SWOSU to impanel a task force to study this issue. The SWOSU Sayre task force consulted widely with stakeholders on the issue before drafting recommendations.

"This is necessary in the unfortunate decade-plus history of severe cuts in state funding for public universities in Oklahoma and in light of enrollment declines at the Sayre location," SWOSU President Dr. Diane Lovell said. "Our present focus is to maintain the Sayre location's functionality and operation."

The changes at the remote location in Sayre will allow SWOSU to continue its legacy of providing affordable, accessible education in southwestern


