#### 115th Annual Hydro Free Fair opening up this weekend

The Hydro Free Fair will be in full swing on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, August 18th - 20th at the fair grounds between City Park, 3rd St. and Cowles Ave. in Hydro, OK. The Hydro Free Fair has many events, rides, and games for people of all ages, and consistently delivers as

Oklahoma's oldest community fair.

Beginning in September 1904 (and then dubbed "The Harvest Festival"), the Fair solely featured exhibits from local farmers and ranchers. A few years later, the official start of the Free Fair began in 1907 with the inclusion of other attractions like rides, games, and prizes. The most popular attractions according to the Hydro Historical Society were "giant smoke balloons, a greased pole, and shooting matches with neighboring gun clubs participating." At the time, Hydro's agricultural exhibits commonly went on to win first prizes at the Oklahoma State Fair.

People came from all over the state by trains to compete in roping contests, livestock shows, and to grab a slice of

# Hope is Alive to host Sobriety Sprint this Saturday

Hope is Alive (HIA) is holding their annual Sobriety Sprint on Saturday, August 20th. The TZ Memorial Sobriety Sprint was first held five years ago in honor of Zach Arismendez who passed away on June 4th, 2017. The first memorial sprint brought in hundreds of runners in support of Zach and the team at Hope is Alive. So, they decided to make it an annual celebration; not of just their friend, but of all who have been touched by the journey to sobriety. Today, the Sobriety Sprint is open to anyone, with runners honoring those lost to addiction and those in all stages of sobriety, and is full of fun, family-friendly support where people can celebrate becoming clean &

sober and get motivated to continue their journey.

This is the 6th Sobriety Sprint and is being held in four locations with award pins, a DJ, fellowship, and a special memorial along the course. Each registered racer "will receive a runner t-shirt, an HIA string bag, a Sobriety Sprint Medal, and a pair of HIA sunglasses!" Runs will be held in Oklahoma City, Tulsa, Wichita and in Weatherford. Race times begin with same-day registration at 7:45am, announcements and a group photo at 8:40am, and the start of the race/fun walk at 9am. The Weatherford location is hosted by the First Baptist Church on East Davis Avenue. Early packet pickups are available on Friday, August 19th

between 10am and 5pm at the First Baptist Church.

Sign-ups for early registration, sponsorship, and volunteering can be done at sobrietysprint.com. All proceeds will go to the Hope is Alive Scholarship Fund.

Hope is Alive was founded with a mission to "radically change the lives of drug addicts, alcoholics, and those that love them." The program was started by Lance and Ally Lang with the goal to lead program graduates to long term sobriety through personal guidance and support in homes where they will experience new ways to work towards sobriety. Their three-phase program offers a tailored and



#### **Need an Appraisal?**

By definition, an Appraisal is an opinion of value. Opinions can vary and it has often been said that no two appraisers will agree. While this can be true, by following accepted procedures, called methodology, these differences between appraiser's opinions can be minimized. The needs for an appraisal can be varied and many.

1. The most common appraisal need is for the purpose of borrowing money to purchase a home or any other piece of property. It may be for a business. Most lenders require an appraisal of the property being purchased or used as collateral to secure the loan. In some cases, by Federal Regulations, this appraisal must be performed by a State Certified Licensed Appraiser. In other cases, usually depending on the amount of value, a license is not required. In most cases, the lender must be the one to order the appraisal.

2. Another reason for needing an appraisal, could be pricing your property for sale, Many times, if you are listing the property with a Realtor, they will provide what is called a market analysis, which can be a form of an appraisal. Keep in mind, not all real estate personnel are qualified to appraise real estate. Their training is mostly dedicated toward the ethical handling of sales.

3. Other appraisal uses include; legal disputes, such as a divorce or a land division, such as a partition suit. The settlement and basis computation for an estate may require an appraisal. Most of these types of appraisals do not require a licensed individual.

The cost of an appraisal will vary with its use, size and time to secure the needed data. You can always ask for an estimate of cost before engaging an appraiser. Remember, experience in appraisals can be critical to good methodology.



watermelon provided by local farmers. Community ball games were held in the evenings and an outdoor auditorium was erected for music and entertainment. The Blue Ribbon Bakery dazzled audiences with its tantalizing 270-pound cake, as time went on and the fair grew, more shows, games, and contests were added.

When WWI broke out and the country had other things on its mind, the fair was canceled. When the war ended, Hydro's Free Fair bounced back in full swing and quickly resumed its exponential growth. By WWII, the fair was bigger than ever and never took a break or looked back ever since.

During the early fair days, live entertainment came with many surprise weddings! The couples would be kept secret from the crowd and part of the event's fun and charm came from attendants trying to guess who the participants could be. Local businesses would present the couple with gifts and good wishes. The first couple to marry at the fair was Claude Bixler and Adella Fields on September 6th, 1935.

By 1925, the fair raised enough money to build an exhibit hall and the fair was moved to the city park. The new change of scenery was a major success, boasting more room and more fun. Following its new found success, the town constructed pens and sheds for the livestock and a community building for additional programs and exhibits; completed in 1935, the new sanctioned location and amenities bolstered the fair's numbers to become the largest in Caddo county and its county neighbors.

In 1955, the Hydro Amusement Company was formed to handle all entertainment aspects of the fair. With this step, the fair was now completely and officially run by Hydro residents – citizens and local businesses built and worked stands, ran food vendors, constructed rides, and hosted games.


With each passing year, the fair brought in more and more visitors, and during the 1980s added the famous Green Machine, Octopus, and various kiddie rides. Concessions and token games were added, and the fair quickly required year-round attention. Weeks of planning and hard work go into making sure every year's fair has 3-days of the greatest entertainment Fall can bring. In 1997, with the addition of the Hustler, the fair became the must-stop spot for many Oklahomans.

Today, the Hydro Free Fair is featured prominently on travel guides and destination polls and is one of the biggest and best fairs to attend in Oklahoma. Attendance continues to remain free for everyone, and tickets for the rides/games are available at the fairgrounds each night.







Last year, the pet-food company said it planned a \$5.7 million expansion of its facility in Clinton.



# HIGHER GROUND

The Age of Outrage



"This is the age of the half-read page, the mad dash, the quick hash, until the spring in sprung and the fun is done." I heard that phrase at a student conference over fifty years ago. While the same could describe society today, another phrase could be added. It is the age of rage. Civility and critical thinking seems to have gone out the window.

In his book, Christians in the Age of Outrage, Ed Stetzer calls for the Christian community to bring our best when the world is at its worst. Each side of the political aisle does its best to find something to be outraged about. Too often followers of Christ join in without thinking through or making any effort to check the facts or look beneath the surface statements.

Stetzer points out an example when he references a controversy in 2015 regarding the alleged removal of Merry Christmas from the Starbucks red cups. Joshua Feuerstein posted a Facebook message saying, "Starbucks removed Christmas from their cups because they hate Jesus." Some called for the boycott of Starbucks and other condemnatory statements were made against the company. It turns out that the accusation was completely untrue. Starbucks in the previous six years had never put the words "Merry Christmas" on their holiday cups.

The political left has committed its share of sins in this regard. The traditional view of marriage has been at the center of Christian theology for centuries, including most evangelical, as well as Roman Catholic, Orthodox, and other organizations. Yet Chick-fil a, when stating its Christian belief, was soundly criticized and banned from many places of business, including some airports. Yet no attempt was made to give the company freedom to express

or discuss their Christian stance. In their accusation of intolerance their accusers became the ugly face

It this age of the erosion of Christian values and the efforts to push God out of the picture, it is difficult for followers of Christ to remain Christ-like in their vocal expressions and responses. But we must not take on the same mindset and behavior of the enemy. Indeed, we must recognize that the enemy is not flesh and blood, but a Spirit of Satan causing us to damage our witness and reducing our effectiveness.

We must learn to respond in a Christ-like manner. James 1:19, 20, gives us good advice. "My dear brothers take note of this: let every man be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry, for man's anger does not bring about the righteous life that God desires.

Again I quote Stetzer, "It is easy to insult and yell. It is easy not to rock the boat. Engaging the world is hard. It requires intentionality, faithfulness, love, and courage. But I believe it is what God calls every believer to do. So let's dig in." to comment: jhm82@ outlook.com or 580-302-1142
