

# The POWER of Prayer



I don't believe anyone would confess that they want to live a life of weakness. In our heart we would like to have significance--to make a difference.

Certainly, that was the desire of Christ when he told his disciples to wait, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you; and

you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

# Oklahoma Transportation Commission Approves Eight Years of Projects

The Oklahoma Transportation Commission

has approved nearly \$9 billion in highway construction and safety projects in the newest edition of the Oklahoma Department of Transportation 8-year construction work plan for the fiscal years of 2025-2032.

An \$8 million widening and resurfacing project is planned in fiscal year 2026 on State Highway 54 beginning nearly 7 miles north of Interstate 40 and extending north by 5 miles.


A \$9.5 million grade, drain, and surface project is planned in the fiscal year 2027 on State Highway 33 in the city of Thomas.

A \$17 million widening, resurfacing, and bridging project is planned in fiscal year 2030 on Highway 33, 4.5 miles east of U.S. 183 extending northeast 8 miles. Meanwhile, an \$11.5 million widening, resurfacing, and bridging project is planned on State Highway 33 in the fiscal year of 2032 that will begin on the east side of Thomas and extend just over 7 miles to the Dewey County line.

In western Oklahoma, a more than \$59 million interchange improvement project along Interstate 40 at I-40 Business in Clinton is scheduled for fiscal year 2025. That is the traffic improvement project at exits 65 and 65A in Clinton.

Dr. Curry was recognized last week, receiving the rural health lifetime achievement award. Dr. Kalie Kerth nominated Dr. Curry for the award. She noted his dedication to rural health regarding the expanding and developing of programs for community-based healthcare services in collaboration with local pharmacies and hospitals across the state.

Angela Marsee of the second judicial district was the guest speaker at the Weatherford area economic development foundation meeting recently. Marsee says fentanyl related criminal cases are continuing to increase since 2020. Marsee says two of the cases in Washita County involve a homicide case in which a toddler was exposed to the drug and died.

**STATE JUDGE INTERVIEWS -** Interviews will be conducted Friday, October 18, by the Judicial Nominating Commission to fill an opening for District Judge in the second judicial district. 



Part of the decision to move likely came from the desire to get softball included as an Olympic sport in the early '60s. Shortly after the move, softball teams, who had been pushing for Olympic inclusion, began to promote new events, encourage new players, and compete in nationwide and international games.

However, despite the sport reaching its Olympic requirement in 1965, Olympic organisers did not include softball in the Olympics until 1996. Although, by this time, the USA Softball Hall of Fame Complex (built in 1987) had been raking in publicity and fans from around the world.

The Complex had been hosting worldwide games and is regarded as one of the finest softball facilities in the nation.

Softball was an Olympic sport from 1996 to 2008, and during this time, its popularity skyrocketed. Team USA dominated during these 4 Olympic periods with 3 Gold Medals and 1 Silver Medal. In the 1996 season, the United States won gold with only one loss due to a base error which resulted in a run not scoring (they lost by one run).

American Hall of Famer Lori Hannigan pitched the first solo no-hitter at the Olympics in a game against Canada in the Summer Olympics of 2000. The 2000 season ignited USA's dominance of the summer league. They would go on to a 22-game winning streak at the Olympics between 2000 and 2008. Their only loss came from Japan in the gold medal match.

Things looked promising for softball and the Olympics until the decision to drop baseball and softball for the 2012 Olympic program "failed to be overturned by a 52-52 vote with one abstention" (ESPN). It seemed to be the end for international competition as countries began reducing their budgets for the sport following the announcement.

Even though worldwide competition was beginning to see a rocky future, the collegiate and


national future for softball was on the rise.


The OKC Complex began hosting the NCAA Women's College World Series, the World Cup, the Slow Pitch Championship Series, and the 18U Gold National Championship.

A Softball Hall of Fame museum was established to honor many of the great athletes that helped drive the sport. By the mid-2000s, The 5-star facility and museum were booking 150,000 fans and had events slated for up to 30 weekends a year.

Then, in 2016, the International Olympic Commission voted to include baseball and softball in the 2020 Summer Olympics. At the Olympics, the US team won a silver medal, with Japan winning Gold and Canada placing silver.

# SWOSU Bulldogs Bested by Arkansas Tech in Final Quarter

SWOSU Football suffered a 29-19 loss at Arkansas

Tech on Saturday night, with three fourth-quarter

turnovers sealing their fate. The Bulldogs (2-4) led for nearly three quarters until Tech took their first lead on the final play of the third quarter.

The fourth quarter was a wild ride, but didn't end in SWOSU's favor.

Trailing 15-12, quarterback Kai Kunz was picked off three plays into the fourth quarter, resulting in a 15-yard pick-six that pushed Tech's lead to 22-12. However, Kunz and the Dawgs responded with an eight-play touchdown drive, capped off by a 28yard touchdown 'pass' to Michael Arceneaux II. Arceneaux, in motion, took a ball from Kunz and sprinted down the sideline to make it 22-19 with 9:38 left.

A muffed kickoff recovery by James Thomas set SWOSU up at the ATU 22, but a fumble inside the 10-yard line killed the momentum. Tech scored six plays later to push the lead back to 10, and another interception sealed the result.

In the first half, SWOSU led by scores of 6-2, after a blocked extra point, and 12-8 after failed two-point tries by both Tech and SWOSU.

Kunz finished 16-for-24 passing for 177 yards and added 93 rushing yards on 25 carries with two other scores.

Defensively, Keshaun Jackson had 12 tackles, while James Thomas added 10. Desmond Greene intercepted his fifth pass of the season in the first quarter.

SWOSU totaled 301 yards of offense, compared to Tech's 327. The Bulldogs converted 11-of-16 third downs, a season best. It's the second time this season the Bulldogs eclipsed the 300-yard mark on offense.

Next up, SWOSU travels to face Oklahoma Baptist on October 19, followed by Homecoming on October 26 against Southeastern.






