The Hydro Chamber of Commerce will be hosting their annual "Christmas on Main Street" event in the morning and early afternoon hours of December 20. All are invited to join.

The event will start with a meet-and-greet happening at 9:45 a.m. Refreshments and cookies will be provided as attendees arrive. The festivities properly kick off at 10 a.m. with some caroling.

At 10:30 a.m., Santa Claus will arrive on Main Street aboard the "Fire Engine Express." Together, he and the Hydro Fire Department will travel down Main Street, delivering treats to any nearby kids. Santa will be available afterwards for pictures starting at 10:45 a.m.

At 11:00 a.m., the prize drawings will begin. Spending \$5 at any Hydro store will earn you a ticket in the raffle. If your number is drawn, you'll be awarded something from the \$3,000 prize pool.

The event will also feature an open invitation on Oklahoma's newly refurbished oldest carousel. Free rides will be offered from 11:30 a.m - 12:15 p.m.



## Elle Papahronis and Piper Patterson Earn Latest Bulldogs of the Week

Elle Papahronis and Piper Patterson have been selected as the latest Bulldogs of the Week, presented by Wright Media, the official partner for SWOSU athletic livestreams and radio broadcasts.

Papahronis (Edmond, OK) posted career-high performances across the board last week, setting new marks in scoring, rebounding, and assists. She scored 22 points against Southern Nazarene and recorded 16 rebounds and six assists versus Oklahoma Baptist. Papahronis averaged 18 points, 11.5 rebounds, and 3.5 assists across the two games as the Lady Bulldogs split Great American Conference play with a 69-57 win over OBU and a 70-57 loss at SNU.

Patterson (Amarillo, TX) also delivered a strong week for SWOSU, matching her freshman season high with eight points and seven rebounds while setting a new career best with four steals against Oklahoma Baptist. Two days later, she dished out a season-high five assists against Southern Nazarene. On the week, Patterson averaged six points, five rebounds, four assists, and three steals.

**OSIDA / NEW SPACEPLANE HANGAR** - The Oklahoma Space Industry Development Authority (OSIDA) board has approved the expenditure of funds for a state-owned Dawn Mk II-B (pronounced "Mark 2-B") Aurora spaceplane. The budget will cover the hangar and other associated facilities. The Mk II-B will be a little bit bigger and a little more powerful," explained Oklahoma Department of Aerospace and Aeronautics Director Grayson Ardies. "It will have more fuel, more capability, a little bit better payload opportunity, and be able to take that up to 100 kilometers, get 2 to 4 minutes of microgravity time depending on payload and altitude and weight. [We] believe that is the sweet spot for fundamental research and development." Additionally, the board approved the expenditure of funds for phase 2 of pavement rehabilitation at the Clinton-Sherman Airport in Burns Flat. It was a change order of \$470,000 due to additional concrete work on one of the runways.

**ODOT / PHAROAH AWARD** - Frontier Bridge, the contractor on the Lt. General Thomas P. Stafford Memorial Interchange Bridge in Weatherford, has won what is known as the Pharaoh Award for the highest quality bridge structure completed during the past year. "The award is presented at the annual AOGC Safety Awards Banquet," explained Chief Engineer TJ Dill. "This prestigious award carries the Farrow family name, who are known as pioneers in the bridge construction industry." In 2024, the award went to the U.S. 281 / Route 66 Bridgeport "Pony" Bridge project in Canadian County.

**WEATHERFORD / AIRPORT CRASH** - No injuries were reported on Saturday, December 13, when an airplane flipped over at the Thomas P. Stafford Airport in Weatherford. "It's under investigation as to exactly what the cause was, but he did come in as he was landing, possibly a gust of wind or something that did flip the plane upside down, but there was no injury," said Emergency Management Director Mike Karlin. The name of the pilot is unknown. He says the Oklahoma Highway Patrol took control of investigating the crash.

**HINTON / COACH PRUITT** - The Superintendent of Hinton Public Schools has announced that Coach Craig Pruitt passed away on Sunday, December 7, in an unexpected accident. Marcy Derryberry says counselors and support staff will be available for any student or employee who needs someone to talk to in the coming days. The Oklahoma Highway Patrol has not released details surrounding the accident that occurred on the north side of Lookeba that took his life.

**ELK CITY / TRAFFIC** - Elk City has three new temporary 4-way stops. The intersections at Washington & Broadway, Washington & 5th Street, and Washington & 6th Street have four stop signs each. City officials say the changes are part of a long-term plan for the new fire station, which sits at Washington and 5th street on property extending to Broadway and walker. Eventually, Broadway, 5th, and 6th streets will have stop signs only on the east and west, and traffic on Washington won't stop at these intersections.

**WASHITA CO / PERRIMAN** - A Burns Flat woman is facing two counts of larceny and theft of controlled dangerous substances including morphine and fentanyl. Nurse Jessica Perriman worked for Survival Flight in Altus and was the director of the Burns Flat EMS district. The Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics has been investigating her since February 2025, after nurses at the survival flight helicopter base in altus told police every vial of fentanyl and morphine in the narcotics safe appeared to show signs of tampering. After learning Perriman also worked as the Director of Burns Flat EMS, investigators went to her office and found 26 more vials of morphine and fentanyl that showed signs of tampering inside the narcotics safe.

**SWOSU / BUSEY** - SWOSU has announced a major charitable contribution from longtime benefactors and alumni Philip Busey Jr., and his wife, Heather, of Oklahoma City. The latest generous gift will support the SWOSU Bulldog Angels Fund which was established by 2014 SWOSU distinguished alum and Carnegie native Bill Howell, to benefit SWOSU students in times of crisis.





## Crimson Storm Surges Late in Dawgs Road Loss

Saturday's matchup between SWOSU Women's Basketball and Southern Nazarene was tightly contested through three quarters, but a late surge by the Crimson Storm proved decisive as the Lady Bulldogs fell 70-57 inside the Sawyer Center.

The two sides entered the fourth quarter tied at 40-40 before Southern Nazarene seized control, outscoring SWOSU 30-17 over the final 10 minutes. The Crimson Storm shot a blistering 75% from the field in the fourth quarter to create separation after the game had remained close for much of the afternoon.

SWOSU set the tone early, opening the game with a 15-7 after one quarter of play for their largest lead of the afternoon. Southern Nazarene responded in the second quarter, using a strong stretch to pull ahead 27-22 at halftime. The Lady Bulldogs answered out of the break with a solid third quarter to erase the deficit.

SWOSU finished the day shooting 42% from the field, its second-highest mark of the season, but the

Lady Bulldogs struggled to capitalize at the free-throw line and from beyond the arc. SWOSU went just 4-of-13 (31%) at the foul line and 3-for-13 (23%) from three-point range.

Southern Nazarene University shot 44% for the game, which was bolstered by its late offensive explosion after entering the fourth quarter shooting just 32%.

The Lady Bulldogs found success attacking the paint, scoring 40 points inside. Elle Papahronis led all scorers with a career-high 22 points on 10-of-19 shooting.

Sincere Jackson added 12 points and eight rebounds, while Landry Allen contributed eight points, eight rebounds, five blocks, and two steals.

The loss drops SWOSU to 3-6 overall and 1-3 in Great American Conference play. The Lady Bulldogs will close out the fall semester portion of the schedule next Thursday, December 18, on the road against Southeastern Oklahoma State before the holiday break pauses conference action until January.

## Bulldogs Can't Keep Pace Against No. 5 SNU

SWOSU Men's Basketball hung tough in the first half against No. 5-ranked and undefeated Southern Nazarene on Saturday but could not keep pace after halftime in an 83-55 road loss to the Crimson Storm. The contest marked SWOSU's second straight game against a ranked opponent.

The Bulldogs relied on the three-point shot to stay within striking distance early, knocking down six triples in the first half to trail just 35-32 at the break. Shooting cooled significantly after halftime, however, as SWOSU went 0-for-11 from beyond the arc in the second half. Meanwhile, Southern Nazarene found its rhythm offensively, shooting better than 60% after the break to steadily extend the margin.

SWOSU finished the game shooting 40% from the field but dropped to 22% from three-point range after missing all 11 second-half attempts. Southern Nazarene shot 53% overall, finished 7-of-19 from deep, and went 12-of-14 at the free-throw line. The Bulldogs attempted just five free throws and saw 13 turnovers converted into 19 points by the Crimson Storm.

Tucker Shepherd led SWOSU offensively with 12 points and five rebounds, while Kray Rogers followed with 10 points.
